# The Coaching Staff



**Michele DeGregorio**  
*Head Coach*

Michele DeGregorio is in her fourth year as the softball coach at Bentley University. DeGregorio came to Bentley after 12 successful seasons at Merrimack College, which included a Division II national championship for the Warriors in 1994.

"With Michele's success and background, we are very fortunate that someone of her ability was able to come in and take over our program," said Bentley Athletics Director Bob DeFelice upon her appointment in December 2005. "I think that her success speaks for itself and we hope that she will continue to have as much success at Bentley in the coming years."

In 2008, DeGregorio collected her second career Northeast-10 Coach of the Year award after leading the Bentley Falcons to a 20-24 record, with Bentley the fourth most improved team in Division II (+17).

DeGregorio, who was also an Assistant Athletic Director at Merrimack for 12 years, compiled a 436-127 record during her 12 seasons as the head coach of the Warriors. Her teams captured seven Northeast-10 Conference championships and made 11 appearances in the NCAA Division II Regional Tournament during her tenure.



In all, DeGregorio spent 19 years at Merrimack including four seasons as a player at her alma mater as an All-New England pitcher and second baseman for the Warriors. She took over the head coaching position in 1993 after serving as an assistant coach for three years and was named the NE-10's Coach of the Year after her first season at the helm.

Amongst active East Region coaches in Division II, she begins the 2009 season fifth in total wins and third in winning percentage. Overall, she ranks 29th amongst active Division II coaches with 462 wins.

A native of Lynn, DeGregorio completed her undergraduate studies in 1989 with a bachelor of arts in mathematics. She currently resides in Winthrop with her husband Bob, the current commissioner of the Atlantic Hockey Association.



**Melissa O'Connor**  
*Assistant Coach*

In her second year as DeGregorio's top assistant is Melissa O'Connor, a former two-time All-Northeast-10 Conference selection at Saint Anselm College.

"Melissa is young, but very enthusiastic and energetic and has a passion for the sport," said DeGregorio. "She brings as an assistant coach something similar to what she brought to Saint Anselm as a player."

O'Connor, who played third base for the Hawks, also earned All-New England accolades in 2003 and was the recipient of the Saint Anselm Sportsmanship Award in 2004. After her collegiate playing career, she was invited to play professionally in Europe in the summer of 2005. O'Connor was a captain of her Saint Anselm team and served on the Student Athlete Advisory Committee.

O'Connor, 25, graduated from Saint Anselm in 2005 with a Bachelor of Arts degree in business. She also coaches basketball and softball at Belmont High School and has run camps at Saint Anselm and in her hometown of Belmont, where she still resides.



**Meghan Condon**  
*Pitching Coach*

Meghan Condon is in her third year on DeGregorio's staff at Bentley and works primarily with the Falcons' pitching staff.

"Her knowledge and experience on the mound in very competitive situations has really helped us," said DeGregorio. "She has done a very good job preparing our pitchers both physically and mentally on the mound."

Condon played for DeGregorio at Merrimack, where she was a four-year starter who captained the Warriors her senior year. Condon earned Northeast-10 Conference Freshman of the Year honors in 2001 and was a two-time All-Region selection.

A 2004 graduate of Merrimack with a Bachelor of Science degree in civil engineering, Condon, 26, also works as an engineer for the Wellesley Department of Public Works. A native of Middleboro who played at Coyle-Cassidy High School, Condon currently resides in Ashland.



## Bentley Softball Looks to Continue Improvement in 2009

Last year's Bentley University softball team was amongst the most improved in Division II, improving on the 2007 win total by 18 and remaining in the hunt for a Northeast-10 playoff berth until the final weekend of the season.

With the bulk of last year's position players back, 2008 NE-10 Coach of the Year Michele DeGregorio is optimistic that her team will continue the great strides it made a year ago.

Among the returning starters are the All-Conference double-play combo of senior shortstop **Alex Hitchcock (Abington, Mass.)** and sophomore second baseman **Christine D'Amico (Shrewsbury, Mass.)**.

Hitchcock, high on Bentley's career lists in a number of categories, connected at a .348 clip last spring as a fixture in the three-spot in the order. She drove in 23 runs, scored the same number, tied the

school record for doubles in a season (13) and led the conference in assists (147).

D'Amico, after a slow start, finished at .285 overall and led the team in slugging (.469). Her freshman season was highlighted by a school-record 21-game hitting streak.

They'll be joined in the infield by senior **Dina Ferriero (Tewksbury, Mass.)**, who has made the move to first base after three years in the Bentley outfield. The team's leadoff hitter last spring, she hit .254 and scored a team-best 27 runs.

Bentley's other returning starters include senior catcher **Jenna Crowell (Kennebunk, Maine)**, junior third baseman **Christina Figueredo (Wilbraham, Mass.)**, senior outfielder **Ashley DeRosa (Wethersfield, Conn.)** and sophomore DH **Lindsay Ayers (Brielle, N.J.)**. Like Hitchcock, DeRosa has started every game the

Falcons have played the last three years. Crowell has also been a starter for most of the past three seasons.

DeGregorio will also be looking at versatile sophomore **Maitlyn Kraft (New Braunfels, Texas)** to play a greater role with a year of collegiate experience under her belt.

Junior **Ashley Messina (Hanover, Mass.)** is the only experienced pitcher on the club. She led Division II in fewest walks per seven innings (0.16 with 3 in 128.1 innings) and finished last year with a 6-9 record and 2.67 ERA.

Expected to see considerable action in the center circle is freshman **Tara Fogarty (Chester, N.Y.)**, who won a dozen games during her senior year in high school.

Other freshmen who'll be vying for playing time are third baseman **Jasmine Ortiz (Hamden, Conn.)** and catchers **Megan Blier (Wells, Maine)** and **Chanelle Morse (Lowville, N.Y.)**.

Bentley's 42-game schedule will begin with 10 contests at the National Training Center at Clermont, Fla. Virtually all of the northern portion of the schedule will be against Northeast-10 opponents, with the Falcons looking to become one of eight who qualify for the conference playoffs.

# Bentley at a Glance

## History

- ▶ Founded by Harry C. Bentley in 1917 as a school of accounting and finance
- ▶ Offered first four-year Bachelor of Science program in 1961
- ▶ Moved from downtown Boston to Waltham, Mass., in 1968 to accommodate growing enrollment and student demand or education blending academic study and extracurricular opportunities
- ▶ Approved in 1971 to grant both BS and BA degrees; changed name to Bentley College
- ▶ Graduate School of Business founded in 1974
- ▶ In late 1990s, pioneered integration of information technology into the core business curriculum
- ▶ In 2005, launched the Liberal Studies Major – a first-of-its-kind program for a business school in which students major in business and the liberal arts, and receive credentials in both
- ▶ Doctoral program debuted in fall 2006
- ▶ Bentley becomes a university. The Massachusetts Board of Higher Education approves Bentley's request to change its designation and name to become Bentley University, effective October 2, 2008.

- ▶ Set on 163 acres in Waltham, Massachusetts
- ▶ Minutes west of Boston
- ▶ Free daily shuttle from campus to Harvard Square in Cambridge

- ▶ Graduate students: 1,405; PhD students: 30
- ▶ Average undergraduate class size: 24
