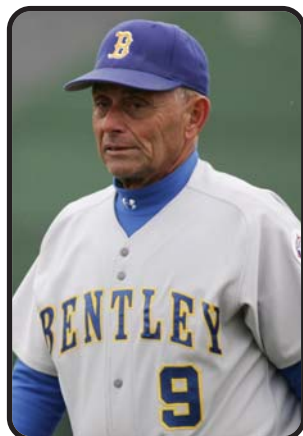

Bob DeFelice Athletics Director Head Baseball Coach

For four decades, since the program's inception in 1969, Bob DeFelice has been Bentley University baseball. The longest-tenured Division II baseball coach in the country is in his 41st season at the helm and is one of five active college baseball coaches whose career dates back to the sixties. He's one of just three who has been at the same place all that time, with the others being Bill Thurston (Amherst) and Bill Holowaty (Eastern Connecticut).



In addition to coaching, DeFelice is the Director of Athletics at Bentley, a position he was named to in October 1991. He's just the second AD that Bentley has ever known.

DeFelice's affiliation with the university dates back to 1968 when he was hired as Bentley's first varsity baseball coach. After coaching the team on a part-time basis from its debut in 1969 to 1987, he was named Assistant Athletics Director for Programs in August 1987. Two years later, he was promoted to Associate Athletics Director.

As Bentley's only head baseball coach, DeFelice has won 591 games during his 40 seasons at the helm, a total that ranks third in New England Division II history.

DeFelice's teams have finished in the top half of the Northeast-10 Conference 18 times in the last 28 years, and three of his players (Jim McCready, Derek Ghostlaw, Mike Hill) have been drafted by major league clubs since 1991. Another, Jack Baird, played in the New York Penn League in 2004.

In 2001, the Falcons set an NCAA Division II record and led all of college baseball by hitting 2.39 home runs a game, knocking an incredible 98 balls over the fence in 41 games.

Since he became AD, the university's sports teams have prospered, with nearly 90 conference championships (regular season and playoff) and NCAA appearances in nine team sports (football, women's basketball, men's basketball, field hockey, volleyball, golf, men's tennis, women's tennis and men's cross country). In 2001, the field hockey team captured the first NCAA championship in the university's history.

Annually from 1997-99 and again from 2001-03, Bentley captured the Northeast-10 Presidents Cup, emblematic of the best overall athletic program in the conference.

DeFelice, a 1963 graduate of Boston College with a Bachelor of Science degree in history, began his coaching career that same year as head football coach and assistant basketball coach at Christopher Columbus High School, a position he held for three years. In 1965, he began a three-year playing career in the Boston Red Sox minor league organization. In 1967, he was a player-coach with the Pittsfield Red Sox.

Before joining the Bentley athletic department staff on a full-time basis in 1987, DeFelice spent 17 years (1970-86) as head football coach at his alma mater, Winthrop High School. During that time, he led the Vikings to a 101-65-2 record, with four Northeast Conference championships, a 33-game winning streak in the early 80's and two Eastern Massachusetts Division II Super Bowl titles.

Amazingly, DeFelice has been inducted into seven halls of fame. He was honored by Boston College in 1986, Bentley in October 1999, and was a charter member of the Winthrop High Hall of Fame in 1997. In November 2002, he was one of four inductees into the Massachusetts Chapter of the National Italian American Sports Hall of Fame.

DeFelice has also been inducted into the Massachusetts High School Football Coaches, the Boston Park League and the Union Printers International Baseball League halls of fame.

DeFelice helped establish the Eastern Collegiate Football Conference and was a founder of the Eastern Football Conference. He served as the EFC commissioner from 1997-2000, when it was absorbed by the Northeast-10 Conference.

Among the many honors he has received are the Jack Butterfield Award from the New England Intercollegiate Baseball Association, the Murray Lewis Award from the Eastern Association of Intercollegiate Football Officials and the Whitey Allard and Marty McDonough Memorial Sportsmanship Award from the College Baseball Umpires Association of New England.

DeFelice and his wife, Patricia, have four children and seven grandchildren.

Kevin Loftus, Assistant Coach

In his ninth year of his second tour of duty as a Bentley assistant is Kevin Loftus, who also was a Bentley assistant coach from September 1994 to February 1999. A former All-America outfielder at UMass-Lowell, the Woburn native is also in his ninth year as an assistant athletics director, with his duties including athletic facilities, game management, scheduling, transportation, and work study.



A third team Division II All-America and the New England Collegiate Conference Player of the Year in 1993, Loftus hit .366 during his two years at UMass-Lowell, helping the Chiefs to a pair of ECAC Division II tournaments and a composite 47-28-1 record. Following his college career, Loftus signed a one-year contract with the Nashua Hawks of the Independent League in 1995.

Mike Hill, Assistant Coach

In his eighth year on the coaching staff is former Bentley two-time All-America and Northeast-10 Player of the Year Mike Hill, who starred for the Falcons from 1994-97. The East Bridgewater native, a 2005 inductee into the Bentley Athletic Hall of Fame and 2007 inductee into the Northeast-10 Conference Hall of Fame, is the program's all-time leader in home runs (43), total bases (387), RBI (191) and slugging percentage (.763), and his .379 career batting average ranks second in school history. In 1996 alone, he hit .410, slugged 19 home runs, led Division II in home runs per game, and had 68 RBI. Hill, who was drafted by the Chicago White Sox, also serves as Bentley's Director of Intramurals.



Bernie Driscoll, Assistant Coach

Back for his seventh year on the Bentley coaching staff is former Falcon infielder and relief pitcher Bernie Driscoll, who started 119 games from 2000-02. During his four years in a Bentley uniform, the Arlington native hit .295, including .324 as a senior, with 22 home runs, 97 RBI, 100 runs scored and 155 hits. He finished his career in 2002 with selection to the All-Northeast-10 third team. In addition to working with the baseball team, Driscoll is Bentley's Coordinator of Recreation, Club Sports and Events.





Young but Experienced Bentley Falcons Enter 2009 with Optimism

Forty years after debuting as the Falcons' baseball coach, Bob DeFelice is still making out the lineup card at what is now known as Bentley University. Now the dean of Division II baseball coaches nationally, the veteran mentor is optimistic about his team's chances as he enters his 41st season at the helm.

Fifteen players return from last year's club, which won 12 of its final 16 conference games to secure a Northeast-10 Conference playoff berth and finished with a 22-19 record against NCAA Division II Northeast Region competition.

Three of the returnees were All-Northeast-10 selections in 2008: starting pitcher **Jarrold Marchesi (Peabody, Mass.)**, first baseman **Garrett Stenhouse (Warwick, R.I.)** and outfielder **James Roche (Arlington, Mass.)**.

Ten position players, including Stenhouse and Roche, started at least half of the games last season, and nine are back this spring. That group accounted for 100 percent of Bentley's home runs in 2008, 85 percent of the hits, 85 percent of the RBI and 84 percent of the runs scored.

On the mound, three of the top four starters are back, including Marchesi and grad

student **Chris Dupay (Scotia, N.Y.)**, a duo who have combined for a 30-16 record during careers.

While there is plenty of experience on the team, the 2009 Falcons will be relatively young as well, especially amongst the everyday players. That group of nine veterans includes five juniors, three sophomores and only one senior.

DeFelice and his staff also have a number of newcomers who they feel could contribute this season. Included are shortstop **Vinnie Eruzione (Winthrop, Mass.)**, outfielder/pitcher **Mark Lane (Tyngsboro, Mass.)** and pitchers **Rob Finneran (Garden City, N.Y.)** and **Dan Murphy (Garden City, N.Y.)**.

Fifty regular season games are on tap for the 2009 Falcons, beginning with 16 during the team's two season-opening trips to central Florida. Bentley will play seven games against Sunshine State Conference teams from Feb. 14-22, and will play nine more, all but two against Northeast-10 foes, in the return trip Mar. 6-14.

The Falcons will launch their home and conference schedule against Saint Rose Mar. 21.

Taking a look at the 2009 Falcons by position:

PITCHERS

In a wood bat league like the Northeast-10 where runs can be at a premium at times, a solid pitching staff is essential for success, and DeFelice believes he has just that.

Topping the list of veterans are right-handers Marchesi and Dupay. Also amongst the returnees are senior righty **Brett Fistes (South Deerfield, Mass.)** and junior lefty **Matt Boudrow (Dedham, Mass./Dedham HS)**.

Marchesi earned second-team All-Conference honors in 2008 after setting a school record with eight wins. He led the club with a 2.38 ERA, including a sensational 1.25 in nine appearances in NE-10 contests, and completed five of his 13 starts, piling up a school-record 98.1 innings.

Season Preview



Dupay, a starter in 11 games in 2008 after missing 2007 following Tommy John surgery, posted the third five-win season of his career. Like Marchesi, he was impressive in conference action, amassing a 4-1 record with a 2.75 ERA.

Wins were elusive for Fistes last spring (only one in five decisions), but he had a very good ERA (2.53) in 42.2 innings of work. It was 2.64 in six starts and 2.25 in an equal number of appearances out of the bullpen. Boudrow, who was primarily used in relief, lowered his freshman year ERA by more than a run to 4.06, and more than doubled his strikeout production, finishing with 40 in 44.1 innings.

Finneran, a sophomore playing collegiately for the first time, and Murphy are both expected to crack the starting rotation for the Falcons.

The 2009 Bentley pitching staff also projects to include junior **Dean Sandonato (Quincy, Mass.)** and a trio of freshmen: Lane, **Blaine McLean (Medford, Mass.)** and **Matt Sherman (Longmeadow, Mass.)**. Sandonato appeared in 10 games in relief a year ago, and didn't allow a run in seven of those.

CATCHERS

Junior **Mike DeCoste (Chelmsford, Mass.)** is expected to handle the bulk of the catching responsibilities after sharing the starting role with Joe Nardi the last two seasons. Last spring, he hit .242 and was fifth on the club in RBI with 17.

Two newcomers who will be looking to find time in the lineup are freshmen **Greg Baggett (East Bridgewater, Mass.)** and **Jeff Eldridge (Danvers, Mass.)**.

INFIELD

The three constants in last year's infield return this season with Stenhouse back at first base, sophomore **Ross Curley (Lexington, Mass.)** set to handle third again and junior **Charlie Pagliarulo (Medford, Mass.)** projected to spend most of his time at second.

Stenhouse shared the team-lead in RBI last season and topped the Falcons in runs scored (31) while hitting .278 overall. He reached base 77 times, had a .391 on base percentage, and amassed the second most putouts in school history (425).

Pagliarulo also had a solid sophomore year, hitting .277 overall and .291 in conference play. He also got it done in the field, handling 215 chances with only 11 errors. His 142 assists ranked fifth in the NE-10 and fourth on Bentley's single season list.

Curley, a starter in 40 games as a freshman, hit .239 and was fourth on the team in runs scored (23).

Eruzione earned the starting nod at shortstop with his solid play during the fall and the preseason.

Infield depth is expected to be provided by junior **Jason Cusumano (Port Chester, N.Y.)**, who started 23 games at second in 2008 and hit .260.

OUTFIELD

Roche, coming off a season that culminated with Northeast-10 Freshman of the Year honors, tops a list of four returning outfielders for the Falcons. Also back are senior **Kevin Vona (Belmont, Mass.)**, junior **Brett Damato (Commack, N.Y.)** and sophomore **Chris Hardy (Warwick, R.I.)**. Each of the four started at least 41 games in 2008.

Roche, who garnered second-team All-Northeast-10 and Division II All-New England honors as well as NE-10 freshman accolades, led the Falcons in numerous offensive categories. That list included batting average (.342), slugging percentage (.521), on base percentage (.403), hits (65), homers (7), total bases (99) and RBI (32).

Hardy also had a solid freshman year at the plate, with his .294 average second to Roche and his .400 slugging percentage third on the club.

Vona connected at a .251 clip last spring in his third season as a starter and became the 17th player in the program's history to reach the 150 career-hit plateau. Damato tracked down over 100 balls in center field for the second straight season, stole 11 bases and showed improvement at the plate, finishing at .239.

The outfield contingent also includes Lane, a freshman who has displayed potential both as a hitter and as a pitcher.

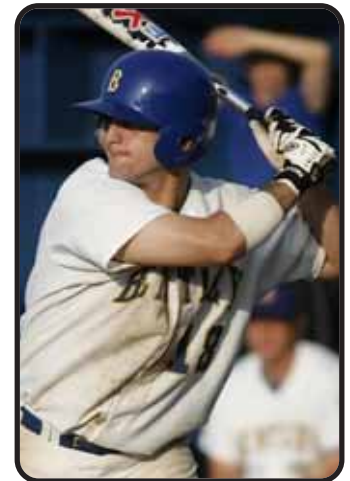

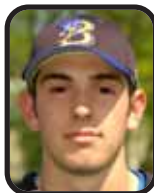

Bentley at a Glance

History

- ▶ Founded by Harry C. Bentley in 1917 as a school of accounting and finance
- ▶ Offered first four-year Bachelor of Science program in 1961
- ▶ Moved from downtown Boston to Waltham, Mass., in 1968 to accommodate growing enrollment and student demand or education blending academic study and extracurricular opportunities
- ▶ Approved in 1971 to grant both BS and BA degrees; changed name to Bentley College
- ▶ Graduate School of Business founded in 1974
- ▶ In late 1990s, pioneered integration of information technology into the core business curriculum
- ▶ In 2005, launched the Liberal Studies Major – a first-of-its-kind program for a business school in which students major in business and the liberal arts, and receive credentials in both
- ▶ Doctoral program debuted in fall 2006
- ▶ Bentley becomes a university. The Massachusetts Board of Higher Education approves Bentley's request to change its designation and name to become Bentley University, effective October 2, 2008.
