# The Coaches...



## Head Coach - Peter Simonini



The 2006 season will mark the 20th season as head coach of the Bentley men's soccer team for Peter Simonini, the winningest coach in school history.

Since taking over as coach in 1987, Simonini's teams have posted a record of 179-160-17 and won four Northeast-10 regular season championships in the 1990's, including back-to-back undefeated NE-10 seasons in 1991 and 1992.

His 1992, 1993 and 1994 teams also captured the Northeast-10 Conference playoff crown. From 1990-97, his teams won at least 10 matches each year. His 2003 team won a dozen games, the most for the Falcons since 1993.

For his efforts on the field, Simonini has been named the Northeast-10 Coach of the Year four times, 1990, 1991, 1993 and 2003. He was also named the National Soccer Coaches Association of America/Umbro New England Region Coach of the Year in 1993.

Amongst active New England Division II coaches, Simonini ranks third in career wins.

A native of Billerica and a 1980 graduate of Plymouth State College, Simonini played seven years of professional soccer as a goalkeeper after being a first round draft pick of the New England Tea Men in 1979. In 1983, he was the MVP of the American Soccer League when he led the Jacksonville Tea Men to the league title.

Simonini posted a national record 43 shutouts and helped the Panthers to two NCAA Division III tournaments at Plymouth State. In 1978, he set a New England record with 14 shutouts while allowing

just three goals all season. In 1990, his alma mater honored the two-time All-America with induction into its Hall of Fame.

Simonini has also been spotted on the touchlines of local professional sides, serving as the goalkeeping coach for Major League Soccer's New England Revolution from 1996 to 1999. He moved on to assist Steve Nicol for the now defunct Boston Bulldogs of

the USL D3 in 2000 and 2001. Simonini then returned to the Revolution in 2004 to retake his position as goalkeeping coach under Nicol, now the head coach of the Revolution. Although he left the Revolution staff full-time during the summer of 2004, Simonini still assists the Revolution on a regular basis.

Simonini resides in Bedford with his wife, Clare.

## Assistant Coach - Robbie Mustoe



Robbie Mustoe joins the coaching ranks this season as the Falcons' assistant coach after an 18-year professional playing career in England.

Mustoe is best known for his 12 seasons in the midfield with Middlesbrough. He began his career in 1986 with his hometown club Oxford United, where he played for four years, scoring ten goals.

Mustoe was signed by Middlesbrough in 1990 and soon became one of Boro's most popular players. He was a co-recipient of the team's Player of the Year award in 1999. Mustoe played in 351 games for Middlesbrough, which included seven seasons in the Premiership. Mustoe made a club record number of Premiership starts and scored 16 goals for Boro.

In 2002, Mustoe transferred to Charlton Athletic, where he played an additional season in the Premiership before closing out his career with a season at Sheffield Wednesday of the First Division.



## Falcons Shooting For Return To The Postseason in 2006

With seven returning starters leading an experienced group that features 19 returning letterwinners, the 2006 edition of the Bentley men's soccer team is looking to improve on last year's record and make a return to postseason play.

Head coach Peter Simonini, in his 20th season at the helm of the squad, says the goals are simple for this year's team. "Our goal is to win as many games as possible and try to make the conference playoffs," says Simonini.

The Falcons aren't the only ones expecting their team to be improved this year. In the Northeast-10 preseason coaches poll, the Falcons were tabbed to finish in tenth place, which would be an improvement on last season's 14th place finish.

Leading the team this season is a trio of seniors, all four-year letterwinners. Forward **Mike Earnest**, midfielder **Ryan McCarthy** and defenseman **Gino Servello** have been selected as captains of the team. Simonini expects their final season with the Falcons to provide extra motivation, as it often is for seniors. "I'm sure each of the seniors wants to go out with some sort of successful season," says Simonini.

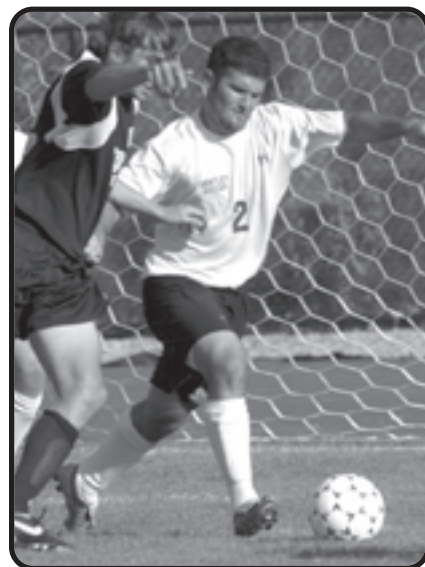
Earnest was an All-Northeast-10 selection in 2004, but has been slowed by injuries. Staying healthy will be a key for him and the team, as Earnest has 29 career points to his credit.

McCarthy is an outside midfielder who also brings a potent offensive game. "He has good endurance and can run up and down the field," says Simonini. "He just needs to play simple and concentrate."

"We have more returning guys there with experience and we've made some good additions this year." The midfield will be counted on to provide an extra boost on offense this season, an area where the team struggled last year. "We didn't score a lot of goals last year so we need to improve on that end," says Simonini. After a promising start in 2005, the Falcons suffered through a stretch of seven straight games without scoring a goal before getting back their offensive touch to close out the season on a stronger note. Simonini will also be looking for a young backfield to rise up and contribute to the team's success.

Servello is a mainstay on the Bentley defense. He faces a tough challenge this year in leading an inexperienced group in the Falcons' backfield. "Gino brings a lot of passion to the game," says Simonini. "He just has to play within himself and make good decisions."

Simonini acknowledges that there are some question marks surrounding the team, but the Falcons also have some definite strong suits. "Our strength is in the midfield," says Simonini.

# Season Preview...



## FORWARDS

Earnest returns as a starter on the Falcons front line, but his playing time up front has been hampered after suffering injuries in each of the last two seasons.

"His biggest concern is trying to stay healthy," says Simonini. "He has all the tools, he just needs to concentrate on finishing his chances."

Joining Earnest up front is freshman **Jared Joaquin**, a speedy player who adds that dimension to the Falcon attack.

Sophomore **Jamey Steadman**, who recorded five points last season as a freshman, and freshmen **Jimmy Alexander** and **Sam Awuni** are also in the mix to see significant playing time up front. "We're looking for everybody to step up," says Simonini.

## MIDFIELD

With four returning starters, the midfield is the most experienced part of the field this season for the Falcons. "We have some depth in the midfield," says Simonini.

Junior **Collin Day**, who started 11 games last season, will anchor the center midfield. Also returning to the center is senior **Nick Wasynczuk**, who factored in four games last season. Simonini expects to see an immediate impact from freshman **Harris Smriko** as well. Senior **Alan Kantapin** provides another veteran presence, starting in the center midfield for the third season.

The outside midfield positions also feature great depth with returning starters in junior **Mike Crepeau** and sophomore **Chris Lipsett**. Crepeau is the team's top returning scorer with six points last season, while Lipsett appeared in every game as a freshman. McCarthy and junior **Michael Delaney** provide additional depth.

Other options for Simonini in the midfield include seniors **Jaime Burnett** and **Ryan Teixeira**, junior **Manuel Freije** and sophomore **Chris Pickul**.

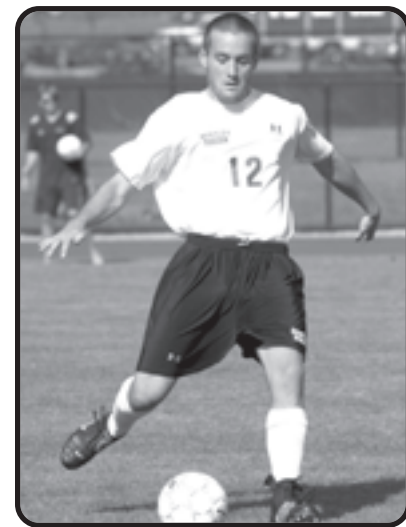
## DEFENSE

A young defensive corps takes the backfield for the Falcons this season. "We're inexperienced back there," says Simonini. "Some of the guys have played a lot and some haven't. We'll be experimenting a lot to see who is going to play where. We can hopefully rely on some of our veterans and some newcomers might be able to help us out."

The Falcons do have three returning starters in Servello, junior **Owen Barrett** and sophomore **Jon Marchetti**. Simonini will also

be looking to sophomore transfer **Geoffrey Cooke** and freshman **Mike Pini** to contribute on defense.

Senior **Chuck Calcagni** and sophomore **Nick Edwards** provide additional experience on defense, while a host of other newcomers are also in the mix in the backfield for this season and in the future with freshmen **Nick Abate**, **Alex LePage**, **Brandon Ranalli**, and **Josh Trubow**.

## GOALKEEPERS

The Falcons face a transition in the net this season after the graduation of Greg Ott, the team's starting keeper for the past two years. Stepping in will be junior **Derek DuBois**, who has played in five games, making three starts, over the past two seasons. In that time, DuBois has amassed a 1.71 goals against average and a .708 save percentage. Freshman **Adam Kilpatrick** will serve as the backup.

## THE SCHEDULE

Bentley opens the season with a four-game homestand at the Bentley Soccer Complex. The season kicks off on Saturday, August 26 with a non-conference match against Holy Family.

The Falcons will take on three opponents ranked in the top 25 of the NSCAA/adidas preseason national rankings. The squad visits reigning Northeast-10 champion No. 21 Le Moyne on Saturday, September 16 in Syracuse, N.Y. The marquee matchup of the

Falcons' 11 home games this season comes four days later when Bentley hosts No. 2 Franklin Pierce, the preseason favorite in the Northeast-10 coaches poll, on Wednesday, September 20. Another tough test will come on Saturday, September 30, when the Falcons travel to New Haven, Conn., to take on No. 24 Southern Connecticut State.

# ***Bentley At A Glance...***



Bentley College is a national leader in business education. We do for students interested in business and related professions what the leading technological universities do for students of science and engineering.

Undergraduate students at Bentley benefit from business and business-related majors and minors that fully explore the impact of information technology, outstanding preparation in the arts and sciences, a faculty of top-notch teachers with real-world research and consulting experience, and a vibrant campus teeming with athletic, social and cultural opportunities. At the graduate level, Bentley delivers a remarkable depth and breadth of business expertise. Master's degree programs groom professionals who are ready to succeed in today's information - and technology-driven business world.

## ***Academic Programs***

Bentley offers a remarkable array of specialized business courses, from the Business Core curriculum to elective courses for majors and minors. This depth of offerings, combined with our emphasis on information technology and hands-on experience in state-of-the-art learning labs, prepares students to succeed in the business world of the information age.

The arts and sciences join business as another integral component of a Bentley education. In fact, half of your undergraduate courses will be in arts and sciences disciplines – what we call the General Education Core. These courses expand your frame of reference and build skills in critical thinking, decision-making, communication and other areas essential for well-rounded professionals.

Whether in business or the arts and sciences, academic programs at Bentley emphasize both theory and practice. Students gain a firm grasp of the historical, societal and other forces that shape a discipline such as management or international studies. Meanwhile, course projects, internships, service-learning assignments and similar opportunities enable students to test business principles and concepts in corporate and nonprofit settings. Bentley professors link theory and practice not only in teaching but in their own research. The topics they investigate are rooted in the complex challenges that leading companies face every day.

While the curriculum offers a breadth and depth usually found only in university programs, the experience at Bentley is student centered. We are a teaching-focused college that offers a personal experience, with small classes and an excellent faculty-student ratio of 1 to 13. There are no lecture halls at Bentley. All of our courses are taught by professors – not graduate assistants – who put a premium on first-rate teaching, research and advising.

## ***Business Core***

All Bentley undergraduates must complete the Business Core curriculum, a group of 10 business courses that offers a firm grounding in key areas of business, including accounting, computer information systems, finance, management and marketing.

In your first year, you'll take the World of Business course, which examines the nature and functioning of business organizations.

Topics include making decisions, setting goals, developing and implementing strategies, and measuring results. Two additional courses, Managing Teams and The Legal Environment of Business, introduce first-year students to other important principles of business.

The Business Core continues through senior year with courses such as Financial Reporting and Analysis, Accounting Information for Decision-Making, Information Support Systems in Business, Data Analysis, Quantitative Analysis for Business Decisions, Integrated Business Functions, and Strategic Management.

Supplementing the Business Core is an additional six credit hours of business-related course work of the student's choosing. Choices range from Cyberlaw to Japanese Culture and Business Practice to New Product Development and Marketing. Students also round out their curriculum with courses related to their major and/or minor of choice.



## ***General Education***

You cannot sustain long-term success in the world of business unless you know a lot more than business. That's why Bentley puts such an emphasis on providing a broad education. Our graduates are literate, articulate, well-read, independent-thinking individuals with a keen understanding of global issues, civic responsibility, and business ethics.

Half of your courses here will be in the arts and sciences – the General Education Core. You'll learn about a wide range of subjects in the behavioral and social sciences (psychology and history, for example); English, philosophy, and other humanities subjects; and mathematics and the natural sciences.

The General Education Core includes the First-Year Seminar, a program designed to help get your college career off to a good start. Led by teams of staff and students, the seminar introduces freshmen to topics such as academic planning, faculty expectations, group process, student responsibilities, individual learning styles, diversity, gender issues, and interpersonal communication. You'll also take an introductory course that covers the broad principles of information technology and the specifics of computing resources at Bentley.
